



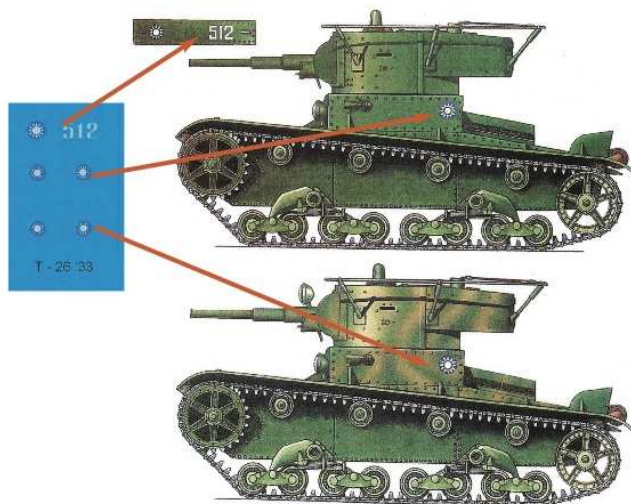
## Asian Armies, WW2 72024

A collection of vehicle markings from Asia. The vehicles date mostly from just before to the beginning of World War II. This first page deals with the Chinese vehicles, the other vehicles are on page 2 of this manual.

**China:** most often, the Chinese left vehicles in the colours of the country they purchased the vehicles from. Hence Russian vehicles in Russian green, German vehicles in German grey, Italian in desert red. An exception is the Vickers amphibious tank.

### T-26 (1933 version)

The top vehicle (200th Mechanized Brigade, Kunming, China 1942) carries the national symbol on the hull side and on the glacis, with the vehicle number 512. The lower vehicle (unidentified unit, Chin Chen-Chaing, China 1944) sports the two symbols on the sides, but has wavy dark yellow camouflage lines.



### Vickers Carden Lloyd amfib. tank

Vehicles of 1st tank Battalion, Shanghai 1937, marking on side of turret. Camouflage: overlapping spots of khaki drill, dark green and light chocolate brown, all with black linings.

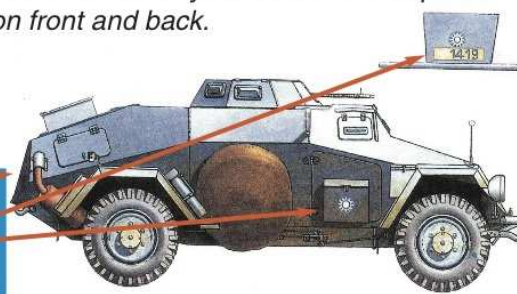
### PzKfw 1a

3rd Tank Battalion, Nanking 1938/39. National symbol on the side. Dark yellow blotches as camouflage.



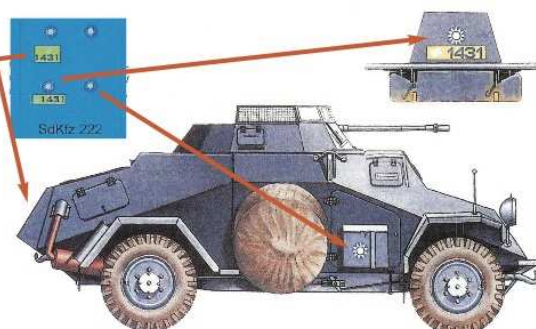
### SdKfz 221

Unidentified unit, 1939. National symbol on boxes on side doors. National symbol with license plate number on front and back.



### China: SdKfz 222

Unidentified unit, 1939. National symbol on boxes on side doors. National symbol with license plate number on front and back.



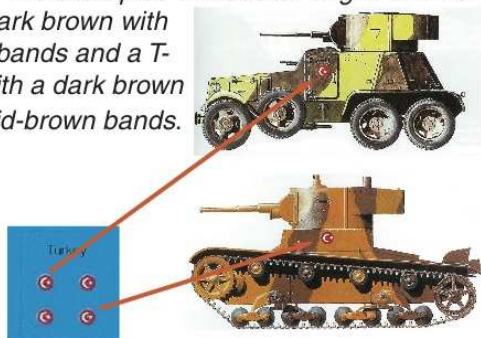
### CV-33

Unidentified unit, Burma 1944. Vehicle number and national symbol on hull sides. Painted in terracotta (Italian desert red).



## Turkey

Vehicles carried the emblem of a white crescent moon and star in a red circle on their sides. Shown vehicles are two examples of Russian origin: a BA-6 painted in dark brown with light yellow bands and a T-26, again with a dark brown basis but mid-brown bands.



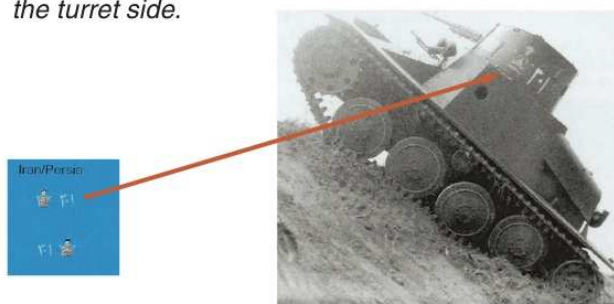
## Jordan Arab Legion

The Jordan Arab Legion used a mixture of mainly British and American light trucks, which were generally painted sand. Many trucks were equipped with MG's. As the Legion was equipped by the British, the vehicle's colors, armament and equipment were the same as the British vehicles. The Legion's nationality sign was normally placed on the vehicle's doors, both on the trucks as on the home-made armoured cars.



## Iran/Persia: AH-IV tankette

This Czech export tankette was painted in a medium grey and carried Iranian signs and figure on the turret side.



## Thailand/Siam: Vickers Type E

This tank is painted dark green. it has the national symbol on the turret side.
