



## Modern Dutch Army: YPR 765 72029

The YPR was developed in 1965 by American producer FMC under the name XM765. When the US Army didn't acquire the vehicle, it was redeveloped and sold to other countries. In the Netherlands it was named YPR-765, and mainly used to carry infantry into the front lines. I have sometimes chosen to double pictures of the decal set, due to the plethora of decals and the need to accurately assign the various decals.

### YPR 765 Command



This turreted UN vehicle was painted entirely white.

### YPR 765 A1 PRI



Armoured infantry vehicle with gun turret during exercises in Germany. Olive greygreen, but the sides seem to have some discolorations. Camouflage?

### YPR 765 MP



Two vehicles from the Royal Military Police, one with a dozer and another with



a wedge to clear barricades. Decals of the two vehicles differ slightly, but the placement of

them is identical. N.B.: the yellow number plate is partly obscured by wedge and dozer.

### YPR 765 Command

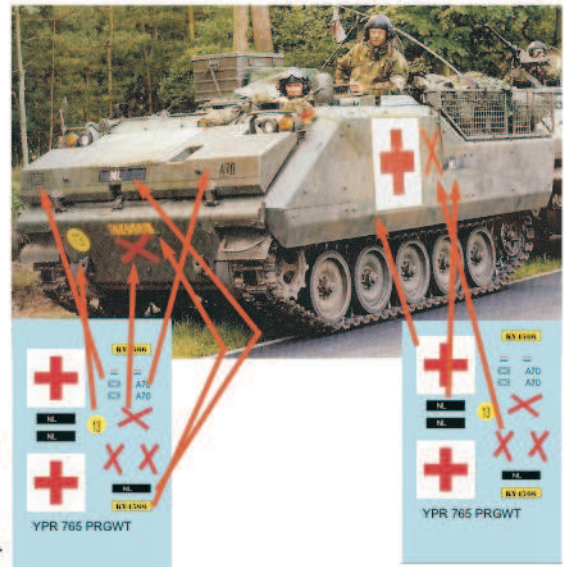


Command vehicle for an anti-aircraft battery, including 3 radio antennas. Painted in

olive grey-green with chocolate brown blotches.

### YPR 765 PRGWT

A medical armoured vehicle during exercises. Room for 4 wounded and 2 medical officers. Olive greygreen, but some darker blotches are visible.



### YPR 765 A1 PRI



Vehicle of the 42nd Armoured Infantry battalion "Limburgse Jagers". Anthracite black and light chocolate brown on olive greygreen.
