

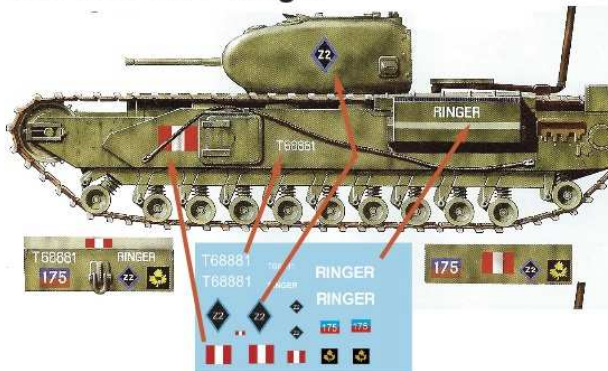


The Dieppe Raid, also known as The Battle of Dieppe, Operation Rutter or Operation Jubilee, was an Allied attack on the German-occupied port of Dieppe on the northern coast of France on 19 August 1942. Over 6,000 infantrymen, predominantly Canadian, were supported by large Royal Navy and Royal Air Force contingents to seize and hold Dieppe for a while. The plan failed. Almost 60% of those who made it ashore were killed, wounded or captured. Also a contingent of vehicles was lost. In this set a number of tanks and armoured cars that went into the fray, most of them were lost or taken over by the Germans.

Because of the plethora of markings on these early vehicles, we have opted to show you the mayor ones, the position of the smaller markings can be easily gleaned from the detail cut-outs.

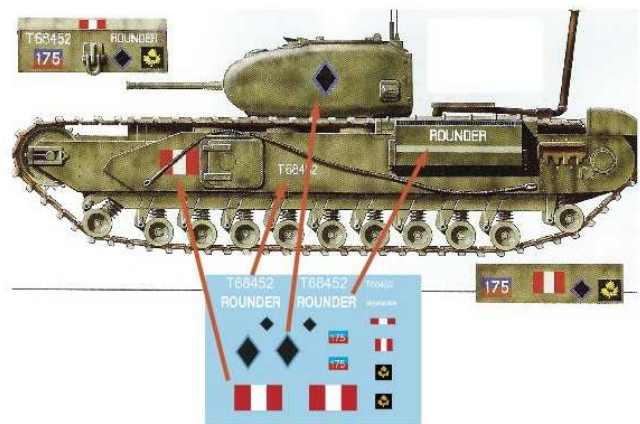
Churchill Mk2 'Ringer'



'Ringer' got its left tracks shot up and became hopelessly stuck on the beach.

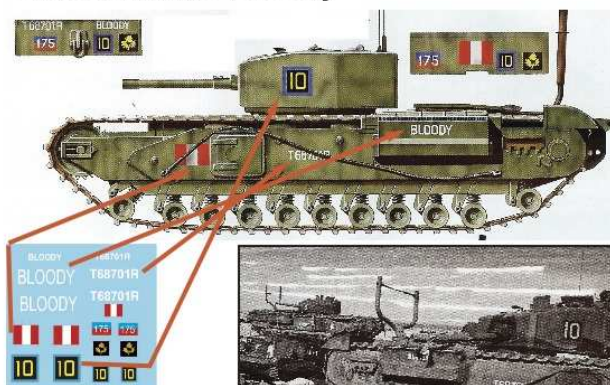


Churchill M2 'Rounder'



'Rounder', commanded by Major Begg - second in command of the regiment -, wasn't able to disembark and returned unscathed to Great-Britain.

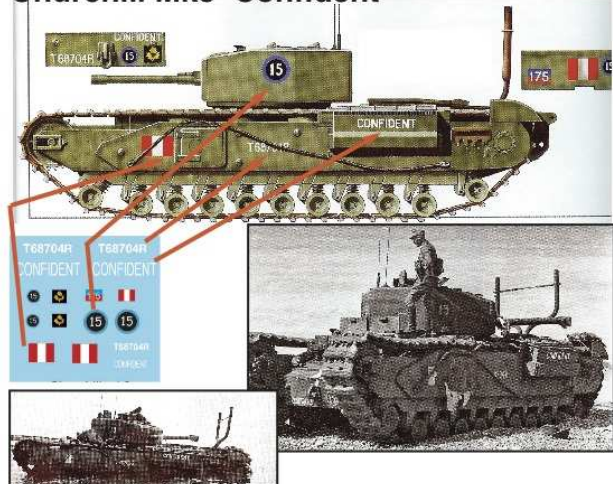
Churchill Mk3 'Bloody'



Sgt. Lee's tank 'Bloody' reached the Dieppe esplanade, returned to the beach where it's right track was shot up.



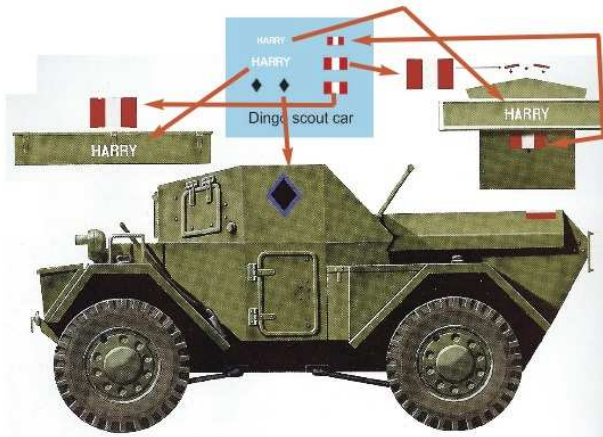
Churchill Mk3 'Confident'



'Confident' was the tank of corporal Dowling. It collided with a scout car it was towing and was abandoned, but not without sabotaging it with some sticky bombs.



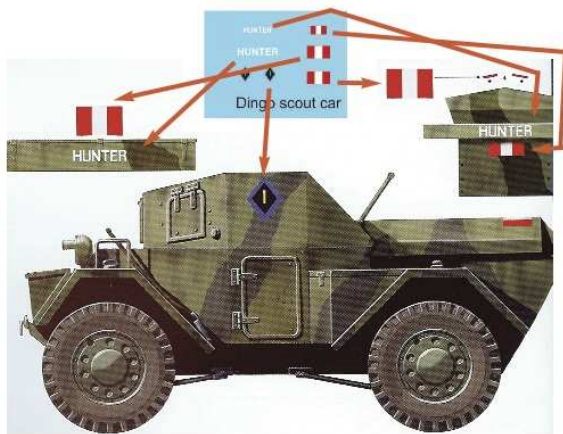
Dingo scout car 'Harry'



Dingo scout car 'Harry' was left on the beach.



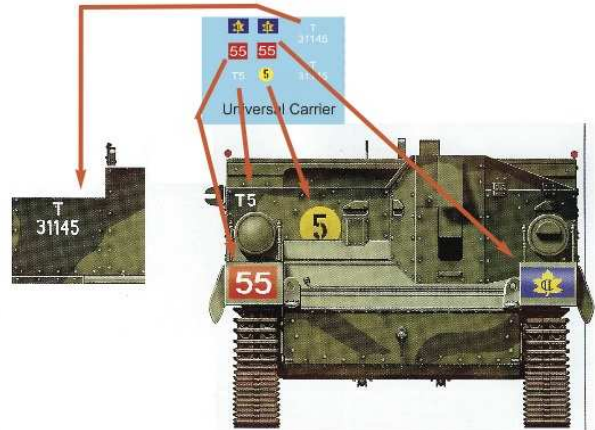
Dingo scout car 'Hunter'



This particular Dingo scout car, called 'Hunter' belonged to the Royal Canadian Corps of Signals; it was towed to the beach by the Churchill tank Bloody.
